## **DIRECTORS' REPORT**

The directors present their report and the audited financial statements for the financial year ended 31 December 2021.

### **Principal Activity and Review of the Business**

MyLegacy Company Limited by Guarantee provides unbiased, useful information to individuals, charities and solicitors about leaving legacies to charities. They work to promote legacy giving and give donors, solicitors and charities the information they need to make it happen.

The Company is limited by guarantee not having a share capital.

There has been no significant change in these activities during the financial year ended 31 December 2021.

My Legacy Company CLG is an umbrella group of national and local charities throughout Ireland. Our group vision is to create social change; to make charitable bequests a normal part of making a will and a widely respected way to support a charity.

It is an example of sector solidarity, innovation and successful legacy promotion, achieving far more as a group than any single organisation could. We work together to help build a sustainable future for all our members. Registered Charity Number: 20141714 and CHY Number: 17122.

Legacies make it possible for charities to sustain their good work, often strategically, over and above the delivery of day-to-day services. However, public awareness of legacy giving in Ireland remains comparatively low, as does the number of people in Ireland who make a will, further reducing the number of legacies that might otherwise be given to charity.

My Legacy therefore works to promote legacy-giving; to build service capacity and sustainability for charities in Ireland, particularly for our members. In this regard, the Company's annual national public awareness campaign in November drives public awareness of the impact leaving a charitable legacy gift can have. It also provides a secondary public service message, highlighting the importance of having a will.

Our Board this year comprises of seven directors, all donating their time in a voluntary capacity. We would like to acknowledge and thank the Board and our development consultant, Ellie O'Donnell, for all their hard work and commitment.

### **2021 Highlights**

My Legacy closed 2021 with a total of 76 members, a decrease of one on the previous year. As the effects of the Covid-19 pandemic ensured continued uncertainty and disruption within the charity sector, My Legacy are grateful for the continued support and engagement from our members and acknowledge a continued increase in engagement with existing and new members throughout 2021.

In March, we held our third LegacyFest event virtually due to Covid-19 restrictions. Once again, we were thrilled to have the event opened by Helen Martin, the Charities Regulator and the event followed with three dynamic sessions. My Legacy Board members and solicitors Bernadette Parte and Susan Murphy took part in a Q&A focusing on the legal side of legacies, a discussion that was led by Valerie Vetter, host of Aftering on Dublin City FM; Becs Lloyd and Clare Martin from the Irish Hospice Foundation led a session on bereavement, language and guidance around dying and International legacy expert Richard Radcliffe finished our session with his best practice guide. Our thanks to all our speakers for their input and participation at the event.

Communication is central to all of My Legacy's goals and outputs, and it was a key area of focus for My Legacy in 2021. We were delighted to welcome Sarah O'Callaghan to the My Legacy board in April. Sarah is Head of Marketing and Communications at Laura Lynn and brings a wealth of experience and support to the My Legacy board. In 2021, Frances Haworth stepped down from the board and My Legacy would like to thank Frances for her valuable input and support.

In July, Alice PR were appointed as our new PR agency to lead on My Legacy Month. Our thanks to Edelman PR for their support and dedication to My Legacy over the last number of years.

As part of My Legacy's strategic planning, we identified that the organisation could significantly contribute to its goals by seeking legislative change. Our advocacy sub-committee developed a pre-budget submission paper calling on government to foster an improved environment for philanthropic and legacy giving by implementing a simple, low-cost measure to remove VAT from the cost of making a Will if a charity bequest is included. My Legacy also sought the input and engagement of other bodies in the sector and our thanks to the Wheel, CII, Philanthropy Ireland and Business to Arts for their engagement.

In November, we were delighted to meet with Minister Joe O'Brien to discuss our pre-budget submission.

My Legacy Month was launched in November. With the support of garden designer Diarmuid Gavin, we asked the Irish public to plant a seed and grow your legacy. We were delighted to include a number of our members in our campaign photo call on the day to highlight the spectrum of Irish charities who make up My Legacy's members, and represent the work the Irish charity sector does. Our thanks to Irish Guide Dogs for the Blind, ARC Cancer Services, the RNLI and the ISPCA for taking part.

To conclude, 2021 was a very successful year for My Legacy, thanks to the support and engagement of our members. As an organisation we acknowledge an increase in interest by new members, increased engagement from members and an appetite for collaboration across the Irish charity sector and with international colleagues. As Chair, I would also like to recognise our deeply engaged board, whose ongoing commitment to My Legacy's goals ensures the organisation continues to evolve, and to recognise Ellie O'Donnell, Development Consultant to My Legacy who is the driving force for the organisation.

## **Financial Results**

The surplus for the financial year amounted to €8,799 (2020 - €9,368).

At the end of the year, the company has assets of €28,290 (2020 - €36,739) and liabilities of €38,842 (2020 - €56,090) which included deferred income of €30,017 (2020 - €33,108), therefore liabilities excluding deferred income was €8,825 (2019 - €22,982). The net liabilities of the company have decreased by €8,799.

# **INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT**

## **to the Members of My Legacy Company Limited by**

### **Report on the audit of the financial statements**

#### **Opinion**

We have audited the financial statements of MyLegacy Company Limited by Guarantee ('the company') for the financial year ended 31 December 2021 which comprise the Income and Expenditure Account, the Balance Sheet, the Reconciliation of Members' Funds, the Cash Flow Statement and notes to the financial statements, including the summary of significant accounting policies set out in note 2. The financial reporting framework that has been applied in their preparation is Irish Law and FRS 102 "The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland", issued in the United Kingdom by the Financial Reporting Council, applying Section 1A of that Standard.

In our opinion the financial statements:

## NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

for the financial year ended 31 December 2021

### 1. General Information

MyLegacy Company Limited by Guarantee is a company limited by guarantee incorporated and registered in the Republic of Ireland. The registered number of the company is 415644. The registered office of the company is 43 Seapoint Avenue, Monkstown, Co. Dublin which is also the principal place of business of the company. The nature of the company's operations and its principal activities are set out in the Directors' Report. The financial statements have been presented in Euro (€) which is also the functional currency of the company.

### 2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

The following accounting policies have been applied consistently in dealing with items which are considered material in relation to the company's financial statements.

#### Statement of compliance

The financial statements of the company for the financial year ended 31 December 2021 have been prepared in accordance with the provisions of FRS 102 Section 1A (Small Entities) and the Companies Act 2014.

#### Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared on the going concern basis and in accordance with the historical cost convention except for certain properties and financial instruments that are measured at revalued amounts or fair values, as explained in the accounting policies below. Historical cost is generally based on the fair value of the consideration given in exchange for assets. The financial reporting framework that has been applied in their preparation is the Companies Act 2014 and FRS 102 "The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland" Section 1A, issued by the Financial Reporting Council.

The company qualifies as a small company as defined by section 280A of the Companies Act 2014 in respect of the financial year, and has applied the rules of the 'Small Companies Regime' in accordance with section 280C of the Companies Act 2014 and Section 1A of FRS 102.

#### Income

Income is derived from grants, donations and subscriptions from members, it is recognised in the financial statements in the period to which the income relates.

#### Trade and other debtors

Trade and other debtors are initially recognised at fair value and thereafter stated at amortised cost using the effective interest method less impairment losses for bad and doubtful debts except where the effect of discounting would be immaterial. In such cases the receivables are stated at cost less impairment losses for bad and doubtful debts.

#### Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents comprise cash at bank and in hand, demand deposits with banks and other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less and bank overdrafts. In the Balance Sheet bank overdrafts are shown within Creditors.

#### Borrowing costs

Borrowing costs relating to the acquisition of assets are capitalised at the appropriate rate by adding them to the cost of assets being acquired. Investment income earned on the temporary investment of specific borrowings pending their expenditure on the assets is deducted from the borrowing costs eligible for capitalisation. All other borrowing costs are recognised in profit or loss in the period in which they are incurred.

#### Trade and other creditors

### Taxation and deferred taxation

Current tax represents the amount expected to be paid or recovered in respect of taxable income for the financial year and is calculated using the tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantially enacted at the Balance Sheet date.

Deferred tax is recognised in respect of all timing differences that have originated but not reversed at the balance sheet date where transactions or events have occurred at that date that will result in an obligation to pay more tax in the future, or a right to pay less tax in the future. Timing differences are temporary differences between the company's taxable income and its results as stated in the financial statements.

Deferred tax is measured on an undiscounted basis at the tax rates that are anticipated to apply in the periods in which the timing differences are expected to reverse, based on tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the Balance Sheet date.

### 3. Departure from Companies Act 2014 Presentation

The directors have elected to present an Income and Expenditure Account instead of a Profit and Loss Account in these financial statements as this company is a not-for-profit entity.

### 4. Provisions Available for Audits of Small Entities

In common with many other businesses of our size and nature, we use our auditors to prepare and submit tax returns to the Revenue and to assist with the preparation of the financial statements.

### 5. Income

The whole of the company's income is attributable to its market in the Republic of Ireland and is derived from the principal activity of the promotion of donations to non profit organisations in Ireland.
